



Lincoln Recycling Guidelines

Lincoln Transfer Station hours: Wed and Sat 7:30 AM to 3:30 PM. The Transfer Station on Route 2A accepts household trash only (NO building materials and no office machines) and recyclables. Please be sure all recycled items are CLEAN.

PAPER

Newspapers/inserts
Magazines, catalogs, phone books
Junk mail office paper, brown paper bags
Paperboard
Corrugated cardboard
Pizza boxes please rip off any soiled areas
NO plastic bags, NO soiled paper

CO-MINGLED RECYCLABLE CONTAINERS are mixed together:
METAL, PLASTIC, WAXED CONTAINERS - MUST BE RINSED CLEAN
Aluminum/tin/steel cans and lids (Separate metal tops from bottles)
Aluminum foil and trays
Plastic containers and tops labeled # 1- 7
Waxed containers, e.g., milk, juice, butter, etc
Styrofoam
NO aerosol cans or cans containing oil-based paint
NO unmarked plastic containers, motor oil containers, or plastic bags

GLASS bottles, all colors, with lids removed, now go in a separate bin for glass. NO window glass, dishes, Pyrex, ceramics, light bulbs, fluorescent bulbs

PLASTIC BAGS to be recycled are collected at Donelan's Market or at any supermarket

FLUORESCENT light bulbs are collected in cylinders near the attendants' shed.

NICAD BATTERIES, sorted, go in marked cans in the Shed. Now alkaline batteries (A, B, C, AA, AAA, etc.) can go in the trash. Hearing aid batteries are collected in the shed. Auto batteries are accepted only at the DPW on Lewis St.

EYEGLASSES are collected at the Library

LEAVES AND GRASS CLIPPINGS every day at the DPW yard, **ALSO** on the **FIRST SATURDAY** of every month at 30 Lewis Street, from 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. **Brush on the FIRST Saturday of each month only.** No plastic bags.

CELL PHONES, if working, can be dropped off at the Police Station or at the DPW

ELECTRONICS and white goods are collected on regular Transfer Station days. See operator on duty if help is needed.

TVs, computers, monitors, printers, microwaves, refrigerators, freezers, washers, dryers, stoves, air conditioners (with freon), propane tanks, dehumidifiers, humidifiers, VCRs, DVD and CD players, record players, radios and electronic games.
