

## **MINUTEMAN HAZARDOUS PRODUCTS FACILITY IN LEXINGTON, MASS. FOR USE BY LINCOLN RESIDENTS**

### **What is the Minuteman Hazardous Products Facility?**

It is a regional hazardous product facility currently run by eight participating towns: Arlington, Bedford, Belmont, Concord, Lexington, Lincoln, Waltham and Watertown. The facility will be open seven Saturdays and one Sunday this year to accept hazardous waste from residents whether you are moving or just cleaning out your home. **ALL RESIDENTS MUST PRE-REGISTER ONLINE BY GOING TO THE TOWN WEBSITE.**

### **When will the facility be open?**

The facility will be open seven Saturdays and one Sunday from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM. The 2023 dates are:

September 17 (Sunday)		October 14	November 4	

### **Where is the facility?**

The facility is located at 60 Hartwell Avenue in Lexington at the Lexington brush drop-off.

### **How do I register to use the facility?**

To pre-register go to the Town website and scroll down on the front page. The link to pre-register can be found there under "What's Going On". Fill in your information, choose the date you would like and the time slot. You can estimate the amount of waste you will be bringing. When at the site, you will need to follow COVID-19 protocol. When you reach the drop-off location, you should place your driver's license against the closed window for the ACV Environmental employee to see.

### **What kinds of materials will be accepted?**

Acceptable materials include: Aerosol cans, car products (anti-freeze, solvents, degreasers, batteries, brake fluid), cleaning supplies (bathroom, oven, drain), fluorescent lights, herbicides, hobby/artist supplies, lighter fluid, paint & paint strippers, pesticides, photography supplies, pool chemicals, poisons, waste fuels, solvent adhesives, weed killers and wood preservatives.

### **What materials will not be accepted?**

**Latex paint**, ammunition, fireworks, explosives, asbestos, fire extinguishers, gas cylinders, infectious & biological waste, medicines & syringes, electronics, construction waste, radioactive materials, smoke detectors and tires. You can contact the Board of Health for ways to dispose of latex paint.

### **Is there a limit on what I can bring?**

There is no limit but please be efficient. If you only have one can of oil-based paint or a few batteries, please join with a neighbor. The way the fee schedule is set up, the Town would be charged the same rate for one or two cans of paint, as it would be for 12 cans. The count goes by cans and not by amount in each can, which is different from previous years.
