



LINCOLN RECYCLING GUIDELINES

Lincoln Transfer Station hours: Wednesday and Saturday 7:30 AM to 3:30 PM. The Transfer Station located on Route 2A accepts household trash and recyclables only. NO commercial, building, medical or hazardous waste. Please be sure all recycled items are CLEAN.

PAPER

Newspapers/inserts
Magazines, catalogs, phone books
Junk mail office paper, brown paper bags
Paperboard
Corrugated cardboard
Pizza boxes please rip off any soiled areas
NO plastic bags, NO soiled paper

CO-MINGLED RECYCLABLE CONTAINERS are mixed together:

METAL, PLASTIC - MUST BE RINSED CLEAN
Aluminum/tin/steel cans and lids
Aluminum foil and trays
Plastic containers – kitchen, laundry, bath
NO aerosol cans or cans containing oil-based paint
NO plastic bags, motor oil containers, plastic plates, utensils

GLASS bottles, all colors, with lids removed, now go in a separate bin for glass. NO window glass, dishes, Pyrex, ceramics, light bulbs, fluorescent bulbs

PLASTIC BAGS to be recycled are collected at Donelan's Market or at any supermarket

FLUORESCENT light bulbs are collected in cylinders in the shed.

NICAD BATTERIES, sorted, go in marked cans in the shed. Now alkaline batteries (A, B, C, AA, AAA, etc.) can go in the trash. Hearing aid batteries are collected in the shed.

EYEGLASSES are collected at the Library

BRUSH AND YARD WASTE is accepted Monday through Friday at the DPW yard, 30 Lewis Street, during normal business hours and on the **FIRST SATURDAY** of every month from 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. No bags are to be left at the DPW yard.

ELECTRONICS AND WHITE GOODS are collected on regular Transfer Station days. See attendant on duty if help is needed. TVs, computers, monitors, printers, microwaves, refrigerators, freezers, washers, dryers, stoves, air conditioners (with freon), propane tanks, dehumidifiers, humidifiers, VCRs, DVD and CD players, record players, radios and electronic games.
