TREE REMOVAL ADMINISTRATIVE APPROVAL APPLICATION

Property owners often approach the Conservation Commission for approval to remove trees in a Wetland Resource Area or Buffer Zones on their property because they either pose a safety threat or interfere substantially with the use of property. Therefore, the Conservation Commission has developed a Tree Removal Policy.

The Commission has jurisdiction over the following Jurisdictional Areas:

- Wetland Resource Areas: defined as 100-year flood zones, wetlands, streams, ponds, & marshes.
- Buffer Zones: land within 100 feet of a Wetland Resource Area
- Riverfront Areas: land within 200 feet of a perennial stream.

Policy: No trees may be cut from Jurisdictional Areas unless permission has been granted by the Conservation Commission. This policy applies to all Jurisdictional Areas, whether natural or landscaped. Landscaped areas are those locations comprised predominantly of lawn or landscaping shrubs. Natural areas are those areas comprised predominantly of naturally occurring vegetation.

Landowners must obtain prior permission from the Commission before work of any kind (e.g., tree or brush removal or trimming, vegetation removal or cutting, lawn expansion, soil grading, and construction) is conducted in a Jurisdictional Area. Wetlands, Buffer Zones and Riverfront Areas often appear dry and thus difficult to identify, so all landowners are encouraged to contact the Conservation Office at 781-259-2612 to discuss any proposed work.

Ecological Value of Trees: Trees in Jurisdictional Areas perform ecological functions by providing habitat for wildlife, reducing flood elevations, stabilizing soil, assisting nutrient uptake that improves water quality, and providing shade that contributes to healthy vegetation and cool water. Even dead trees provide habitat for cavity nesters and organic nutrients for soil.

Review and Approval Process:

- Conservation Staff Administrative Review/Approval - Conservation Staff may administratively approve up to five (5) trees within Jurisdictional Areas as described in this policy.
- Formal Conservation Commission Review/Approval - If tree removal in a Jurisdictional Area is proposed beyond what Conservation staff are authorized to approve pursuant to this policy, such removal may be permitted by the Conservation Commission, provided that the owner files a Request for Determination of Applicability or Notice of Intent, and the Conservation Commission permits such removal.

What is the process of getting approval to remove a hazard tree near wetlands?

- Please fill out and submit the Tree Removal Application Form on Page 2 and submit this application form.
- Please submit the informal map or sketch that shows the location (if known) of existing Wetland Resource Areas (including Riverfront Area) and the 100-foot buffer zone, house, trees, and other relevant features; and the location of proposed trees to be cut (numbered in a way that can be cross-referenced with application). - Conservation Staff will perform a site visit.
- If your request complies with the Tree Removal Policy, staff will approve your request generally within 5 business days.

D. **Tree Mitigation Requirements and Conditions**

The loss of trees cut in a Wetland Resource Area or NDZ shall be mitigated as follows:

- Large trees (>12" DBH): the owner shall plant 1 native tree sapling or 2 native shrubs for each large tree cut.
- Small trees (<12" DBH): the owner shall plant 1 native tree sapling or one native shrub for each small tree cut.

- Location of existing Wetland Areas and the 100-foot buffer zone, house, trees, & other relevant features.
- Location of proposed trees to be cut (numbered in a way that can be cross-referenced with the Tree Cutting Request Form); and
- Location where proposed mitigation trees or shrubs (if required) will be planted.
